To schedule service, please call 817-317-2000. Examples of items to schedule for bulk waste pickup are mattresses, furniture, home construction debris (see their website for allowed materials), and large appliances (without freon). Call Republic Services for acceptable bulk waste items at your address. HHW Solutions already offers household hazardous waste pickup to citizens. Go to http://hhwsolutions.com/ to schedule a pickup at your home. Examples of acceptable items include used motor oil and used cooking oil (screw top lid), batteries of all kinds, paint of all kinds, and light bulbs of all kinds. REMINDER: Garbage/Recycling Rate Increase: You will see an increase on your April bill for garbage/recycling rates. The last time rates were increased was in 2019. Residential rates will increase from \$16.53 to \$16.95. The additional recycling cart rate will increase from \$2.07 to \$2.15. Commercial hand collect rates will increase from \$20.62 to \$21.11.

Lock Your Box Campaign: We are pleased to announce that our DWG DPS/CPSAAA Lock Your Box Campaign is starting back up again. We would like to continue to encourage all of our DWG citizens to join us in our efforts to help ward off mail theft in our city through this initiative. Some beautiful mailboxes have gone up since we started this citywide initiative in 2018. If you are interested in purchasing a locking mailbox or would like more information, please call Jim Fallon at 817) 478-4773. This is not a fundraiser for CPSAAA, and there are no extra fees or charges added to the cost of your mailbox or installation. Our goal is to help provide you with knowledge of the options available to you in the hopes of helping you to protect your mail and packages from theft. If you do not have a brick mailbox and would like to have one built or if you would prefer to have your locking mailbox on a post, Jim can provide you with an estimate on what those costs would be. If you currently have a brick mailbox, it is likely that a locking mailbox can be retrofitted into your existing brick mailbox. A great big thank you to Jim Fallon for making this project a big success since its inception and for continuing to spearhead the efforts now.

Citizens On Patrol (COP) is back in service, so if you see our marked Citizens on Patrol vehicle, say hello with a wave. The COP program is a branch of our Citizens Public Safety Academy Alumni Association (CPSAAA). Members of the COP program have completed training sessions covering legal liabilities, patrol procedures, communications, and the penal code through our Dalworthington Gardens Department of Public Safety. We are taught to recognize suspicious or criminal activity and assist our police by actively patrolling the neighborhoods and reporting such activities. COP members are only observers/reporters and do not become physically involved or place themselves in dangerous situations. Citizens On Patrol programs have been proven to be a positive factor in decreasing crime in cities, especially with crimes such as theft, burglary, and auto theft. We feel truly fortunate to have this program in our great little city.
