# Mayor's Message:

Happy Easter! This is my favorite time of the year, well, it rivals the Christmas season for first place in my heart. We have so many things to be grateful for. I count my blessing every day in abundance. As most of you know, I have the privilege of serving on the Salvation Army's advisory council. It was brought to our attention that 1 in 6 Texans struggle with food insecurity and the people



around us go hungry every day. Most affected are children, the elderly, veterans, and women. Exactly what is food insecurity? It is defined as the condition of not having access to sufficient food, or food of an adequate quality, to meet one's basic needs. In other words, the big question in their minds is, "Where is my next meal coming from?" We are starting a grassroots effort to help fill the food banks at the Salvation Army and Arlington Charities, two of the biggest organizations who reach those with the greatest needs. We will be collecting food from DWG residents on May 10 at Green's Produce from 10am-2pm on that day. Please consider picking up a little extra when you go to the grocery store. We will be accepting non-perishable items such personal hygiene items, feminine products, canned goods, etc. Monetary donations will also be accepted. No gift is too great or too small. There is a new "project" in Arlington, The Taste Project. I visited the one in Fort Worth, and I wanted to share a bit about it so that we can support this great organization. Taste Project is a 501(c)3 non-profit established simply to feed people, one community at a time. Taste's mission is to feed, educate, and serve our community so they may "...taste and see the Lord is good." Psalm 34:8. Because they believe everyone should have access to healthy and nutritious food, their vision is to see our communities become a solution to the challenges our communities face as they relate to hunger. Their full-service restaurant looks like many others-bright, light, and welcoming. Those in need and those wanting to help are not segregated, creating an environment that is inclusive and approachable. Because their menu has no prices, they ask that people pay what they can, pay what they would typically pay, or pay a little extra to help a neighbor. Except for Mondays when Taste provides basic medical assessments, and financial and nutritional counseling, the restaurant is open six days a week. Breakfast is served 9AM-11AM with lunch served 11AM-2PM on weekdays. Brunch is served 9AM-2PM on weekends. Taste depends on its 80% volunteer staff to support its operations. daily. Taste Community Restaurant will open in Arlington! Located at 200 N Cooper Street in 76011, whether you would like to volunteer or enjoy an excellent meal, come support the Taste movement as they deliver on their promise by serving healthy, nutritious meals with dignity and care for all.

Safety Tip of the month:



As the weather starts to get nicer, we are having lots more people frequenting parks across the area. Park parking lots are easy targets for criminals. It is our goal to raise awareness to this problem and help prevent you from being an easy target. When planning a trip to your local park please make sure to leave all valuables at home, do not leave them in your vehicle. If you must leave valuables in your vehicle while it is unattended, please put the items in your trunk or in other places where they are out of site. Try to avoid hiding items in obvious areas like globe boxes, and middle consoles. Never leave items laying on your seats, dashboard, or floor. Car smashand-grabs happen out of sight and very quickly. Easy items for thieves to take: Cell phones, purse or wallet, laptops, backpacks, shopping backs, cash, and your keys! Ensure that you have locked your vehicle and look through your windows to see if you can spot anything valuable prior to walking away. When walking or running at night park in well-lit areas. Always remember trust your instincts if you see something suspicious call 911 and report it immediately. Never confront anyone yourself.

If you have DWG DPS monitoring your alarm system, please help us complete your yearly update. Please contact dispatch at 817-275-1234 Ext 1 to get a new application form turned in. We request you test your alarm to ensure that all zones are still coming into our center properly. This process is to ensure we can contact you timely if the need arises, and to help ensure you have no technical issues onsite that could hinder our response in the future. For more information on this you may email jsmith@cityofdwg.net. We can email or mail all forms to you to help expedite this process. Also, dispatch is manned 24/7 so we can complete the alarm testing whenever works best for your schedule, this process takes less than 10 minutes to complete. If your alarm system is monitored through a third party and you would like information on DWG DPS free monitoring, please let us know.
