# Water Conservation <u>Tips</u>

- Always turn taps off tightly so they do not drip.
- Promptly repair any leaks in and around your taps. (One leak can waste several thousand liters of water per year.)

As all of you know, the Salvation Army is an organization that is near and dear to my heart. The ringing of The Salvation Army bell is not just a sound of a bell... it is the sound of curing hunger, the sound of Christmas to a child in need, the sound of a safe place for our neighbor to sleep. It is the sound of help, hope, and comfort to our neighbors when they need it most-during the holidays and beyond. The Salvation Army was founded by General William Booth in 1865. So how did soup, souls, and salvation in the 1800s turn into the modern Salvation Army we see today? Kettle collections started in San Francisco in 1891 when a local Salvation Army Captain publicly promised to feed 1000 destitute people near Fisherman's Wharf. The bell tradition began in 1900s with a teenage volunteer who was frustrated by the many bankers on Wall Street who walked by her kettle and ignored her. She went to a nearby Woolworth Department Store and bought a small bell for 10 cents. The rest is history. This organization now gives assistance to others in 131 different countries, including 30 million Americans each year. Velma's service to the city has made a very strong impact on what DWG is today. She served on city council for many years and is our local historian. However, her achievements in music scholarship, performance, teaching, and support of music organizations have impacted communities across North Texas for nearly 50 years. Velma's leadership, musicianship, and dedication to Arlington Community Band spanned more than 40 years. During this time, she not only served on the Board but also spearheaded and managed the Salute to Community Bands annual event, which is heading into its 12th year. She retired from ACB at the young age of 91. Beyond her involvement in ACB, Velma's contributions to music organizations have resulted in lasting, valuable community music outlets across North Texas. For example, she was a founding member of The Texas Flute Society, the Flutissimo Flute Choir, and the Musical Memory Singers. She performed with the Mansfield Wind Symphony as well. Congratulations, Miss DWG, on a job well done!

If you plan on going out of town consider having a neighbor or close friend check the house regularly to pick up mail, newspapers, and packages that may be left throughout the day. If you are purchasing any large new items such as TVs, or gaming systems please consider breaking down the boxes to help conceal what was in the box prior to putting it out for the trash, you don't want to advertise what may be in your house.

If you have DWG DPS monitoring your alarm system, please help us complete your yearly update. Please contact dispatch at 817-275-1234 Ext 1 to get a new application form turned in. We request you test your alarm to ensure that all zones are still coming into our center properly. This process is to ensure we can contact you timely if the need arises, and to help ensure you have no technical issues onsite that could hinder our response in the future. For more information on this you may email <a href="mailto:jsmith@cityofdwg.net">jsmith@cityofdwg.net</a>. We can email or mail all forms to you to help expedite this process. Also, dispatch is manned 24/7 so we can complete the alarm testing whenever works best for your schedule, this process takes less than 10 minutes to complete. If your alarm system is monitored through a third party and you would like information on DWG DPS free monitoring, please let us know.

Trees benefit birds in countless ways. In fact, even dead trees are critically important for many bird species. Standing dead trees are known as snags and they benefit birds by providing food and shelter. Snags may appear lifeless, but take a closer look and you may find a wide variety of invertebrates, which makes snags a great place for many birds to find a snack. Several species of birds will also create or use existing cavities in snags to nest. If snags pose no threat to people or property, consider letting it stand so that birds can continue to benefit.
