For more information on this you may email jsmith@cityofdwg.net. We can email or mail all forms to you to help expedite this process. Also, dispatch is manned 24/7 so we can complete the alarm testing whenever works best for your schedule, this process takes less than 10 minutes to complete. If your alarm system is monitored through a third party and you would like information on DWG DPS free monitoring, please let us know.

Here is a short summary of the 2026 Challenges for the Mayor's Monarch Garden:

1. Raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and other pollinators.
2. Encourage local residents to plant monarch friendly gardens.
3. Encourage planting milkweed and other nectar producing plants.
4. Promote monarch and pollinator conservation and awareness.
5. Provide native seeds and collect native seeds for future propagation.
6. Plant a monarch friendly garden.
7. Add milkweed to community gardens.
8. Provide information at the Mayor's Monarch Garden; label plants at the garden.
