Chief's Message:

We would like to thank an anonymous donor for the pallet of water for our first responders to help combat this HOT and humid weather. We are always in need of cases of bottled water for our responders as they do go through them quickly in this weather. Any cases donated may be dropped off too our dispatch center 24 hours a day, located in the DPS building next to City Hall. Staff will be happy to assist with unloading any donations given.



We have had an increase in snake and wildlife calls over the past several months with all the rain pushing them out of the creek areas and onto residential properties. As most wildlife is very protected officers are unable to catch or kill wildlife unless it is posing an immediate risk to the public. Snakes...the dreaded subject, they are slithering into garages and yards more than normal right now. Please be aware in high grassy areas as they may be hard to see. If you are having problems with either, and need immediate assistance please contact dispatch and we will send an officer out to assist in relocating the animals if possible. Please know that officers will assess each situation on a case-by-case basis and have limited resources.

Tis the season! Our house watch program is in full swing right now with the summer months upon us. If you are new to the Gardens' we want to make sure that you are aware of the house watch program. This is a voluntary program that is offered as a free service to DWG residents. Anytime (year-round) that you plan on going on vacation contact dispatch and fill out a form and we will have officers check your residents twice a day. We offer this program as a proactive way to assist residents in keeping their property safe with no added worries while gone. For more information on this program please contact dispatch.

Enjoy all the wildlife and native plants in our park that are thriving with the additional water. As always, we appreciate when you pick up after yourself but please don't pick from our gardens.

Here are some suggested nectar plants Purple Coneflower, Gregg's Mistflower, White Mistflower, Indian Blanket, Golden Eye Daisy, Turk's Cap, Phlox, and Texas Lantana to name a few.
