May 7, 2022 Special Election: The city will hold a special election on May 7, 2022 for voters to consider the reauthorization of the local sales and use tax in the City of Dalworthington Gardens, Texas at the rate of one-fourth of one percent to continue providing revenue for maintenance and repair of municipal streets. This tax was first authorized by voters in a 2018 election. This sales and use tax specifically funds maintenance and repair of municipal streets and has funded various street projects to include Twin Spring/Twin Lakes, Indian Trail, Orchid Court, and crack sealing in multiple years.

Our speaker was Devin Warner with Metro Mobile Electronics, and they are located at 2310 Michigan Court. New Garbage/Recycling Rates: Garbage and recycling rates will change on your April bill. Residential rates will decrease from \$16.95 to \$16.94. The additional recycling cart rate will increase from \$2.15 to \$2.24. Commercial hand collect rates will increase from \$21.11 to \$22.08.

Code Red Notification System: The city is in the process of moving city wide notifications to Code Red. We encourage you to get signed up now in preparation for the move. The city will still utilize Facebook and the city website on occasion, but Code Red will be the best way to receive notices for utility outages, road closures, projects, and low water crossing notices. You can sign up for text, call, and email notifications. When signing up, please use your physical address, not a PO Box, and use "Dalworthington Gardens" as the city. There are "managed account" and "guest account" options. The "managed account" will allow you to make changes to notifications in the future. "Guest account" would allow quick signup, but you have no control over managing notifications. Sign up here: https://public.coderedweb.com/CNE/en-US/BFFA9500DBE5 or Text "DWG" to 99411.

Safety Tip of the month:

As the weather starts to get nicer, we are having lots more people frequenting parks across the area. Park parking lots are easy targets for criminals. It is our goal to raise awareness to this problem and help prevent you from being an easy target. When planning a trip to your local park please make sure to leave all valuables at home,



do not leave them in your vehicle. If you have to leave valuables in your vehicle while it is unattended, please put the items in your trunk or in other places where they are out of sight. Try to avoid hiding items in obvious areas like glove boxes and middle consoles. Never leave items laying on your seats, dashboard, or floor. Car smash-and-grabs happen out of sight and very quickly. Easy items for thieves to take: Cell phones, purse or wallet, laptops, backpacks, shopping backs, cash, and your keys! Ensure that you have locked your vehicle and look through your windows to see if you can spot anything valuable prior to walking away. When walking or running at night park in well-lit areas. Always remember trust your instincts if you see something suspicious call 911 and report it immediately. Never confront anyone yourself.

If you have DWG DPS monitoring your alarm system, please help us complete your yearly update. Please contact dispatch at 817-275-1234 Ext 1 to get a new application form turned in. We request you test your alarm to ensure that all zones are still coming into our center properly. This process is to ensure we can contact you timely if the need arises, and to help ensure you have no technical issues onsite that could hinder our response in the future. For more information on this you may email jsmith@cityofdwg.net. We can email or mail all forms to you to help expedite this process. Also, dispatch is manned 24/7 so we can complete the alarm testing whenever works best for your schedule, this process takes less than 10 minutes to complete. If your alarm system is monitored through a third party and you would like information on DWG DPS free monitoring, please let us know.

(From the Texas Park and Wildlife)

The Bluebonnet is the state flower. Did you know there are many kinds of bluebonnets in Texas? In west Texas, the tall Big Bend bluebonnet grows up to three feet high! The shorter, more common Texas Bluebonnet grows east of a line going from northeast to southwest Texas. It grows 15 to 24 inches. The flower looks like a little bonnet when you look at it closely. After it rains, look for a drop of water in each bonnet or bowl-like petal.

Blooms March through May.

Bonus: The bluebonnet became the Texas state flower in 1901. Since this flower has look-alike "cousins," the state legislature, in 1971, named all lupine species as the official state flower.
