Chief's Message:

With great sadness, DWG DPS announces the loss of our beloved Deputy Fire Chief Robert "Bubba" Sells. Chief Sells passed away Sunday, January 22, 2023, surrounded by his wife of 36 years and his children. Chief Sells started as a volunteer with the DWG Fire Department in 1989, rising up through the ranks of Lieutenant, Captain

and ending as Deputy Chief. Chief Sells was a pillar of our department and a mentor to all who joined DWG during his tenure. Chief Sells served the communities of Arlington, Pantego, and DWG for 52 years. His love for firefighting led him to the love of his life, his wife, Sydney. Family and friends were of the utmost importance, and his family is a tribute to his legacy of passion and dedication. Chief Sells will be forever missed by all who met him.

Changes are in the works for school zone traffic on Arkansas Ln. The council has approved revising the school zone traffic times for Arlington Classics Academy on Arkansas Ln. New school zone times will fit the needs of students and staff more appropriately for their safety. New times will be 7a-8:30 am and 2:30-4:15 and will be effective starting Monday, March 20.

It is that time of year again! We have sprung forward!!! We want to remind everyone to check their fire and smoke detectors to ensure they are in working condition and that new batteries are installed. Please contact our dispatch center before testing your alarm system so we can ensure that the correct signals are being received.

We have been asked about what they can do to protect themselves better. We recommend installing thermal heat detectors in all attics in your home. This simple, low-cost upgrade can be made to all alarm systems in residential structures.

For most residents that utilize Brent with Home Security Central (817-467-3040), he can facilitate these upgrades to any alarm he maintains. Please note that Home Security Central is a third-party vendor not associated with the City of DWG; however, they are very familiar with how DWG alarms are monitored. Thermal detectors are designed to trigger at high heat temperatures allowing for quicker notifications in the event of a fire.

If you need any assistance changing batteries or testing your smoke detectors, DWG DPS members will gladly assist with this process. You may call dispatch for assistance at 817-275-1234 ext 1. Your DPS team is currently in the process of starting a home inspection team to meet with homeowners when called upon to help residents be proactive in fire and home safety. More detail regarding this program will be sent out soon.
