We all want our kids to take advantage of some of the technological advances that have come so quickly in the past few years. With these advances, though, have come some dangers, particularly those that can expose your child or teen to Internet criminals and even those who prey on young people. Anyone who says that protecting against these threats is easy is selling you something, but there are some commonsense things we can do as parents to help.

The lowest hanging fruit is plucked by making sure your kids' phones and devices are not jailbroken, and that they are updated as soon as possible. Jailbreaking nearly guarantees a cyber infection; blocking jailbreaks and ensuring updates are simply the most effective ways to assure your child's device and data stay safe.

Now, some kids - and these can be otherwise trustworthy, well-behaved, honorable kids - try to disable updates or jailbreak their phones. That's because cool features or hacks that they pass around to one another can be "fixed" or disabled by an update - and they don't want this. It's part of being a kid in the modern world. Yet security experts tell us that this kind of behavior is exactly the sort of thing that criminals and predators hope will happen, because it leaves our kids' phones and apps vulnerable to attack. So it may help to discuss with your child the importance of updates, and to help them update their phone and apps - taking the time to check to make sure updates have been installed.

On an Android phone, from within the Google Play Store, click the hamburger icon in the top-left, then choose Settings. In the General menu, select "Auto-update apps at any time". To save on data, you may wish to click the option to "Auto-update apps over Wi-Fi only." But be careful - kids can spot that weakness, and prevent an update simply by turning off WiFi, which will leave them unsafe and raise your data usage.

On an iPhone, enter the Settings (the gear wheel), select "General," then select "Software Update." The controls for automatic updates are found in the General section of Settings. Select "Automatic Updates.", then turn on the Automatic Updates by swiping the button to the right (green).

There are apps that are dangerous because they can expose your child to content, we don't approve of, and there are some that can have more sinister impact. It's up to us as parents to understand what's out there. Talk to your kids but read up on your own. Spend time going through your child's phone with them and ask questions about what apps you're unfamiliar with do. A good first step is to require that you approve app purchases - this can be done on Android or iPhone.

Some apps, like TikTok, are hugely popular with kids but can expose them to content we as parents are concerned about - and even expose them to security risks. Some, like CashApp, can provide your kid a way to send and receive cash if they're over 13 - even get a debit card. Some, like KiK, are popular but very dangerous because of their use by child predators - police departments here in the DFW area have investigated many cases of teens and pre-teens being contacted and tricked by adults grooming kids. And because Kik is Canadian, getting cooperation can take months, at a time when time is of the essence.

There are millions of apps out there, so we can't cover them all. And there are choices to be made based on our values as parents - there's a great guide to apps you should be aware of at Safewise, which takes the time to contextualize by categories such as "Secret Storage", "Deepfakes", "Explicit content" etc., so you can choose.

It's important to be an educated parent when it comes to apps that run on devices our children use. As with everything with our kids, the responsibility ultimately lies with us.

This is not a fundraiser for CPSAAA, there are no extra fees or charges added to the cost of your mailbox or installation, our goal is to help provide you with knowledge of the options available to you in the hopes of helping you to protect your mail and packages from theft. If you do not have a brick mailbox and would like to have one built or if you would prefer to have your locking mailbox on a post, Jim can provide you with an estimate on what those costs would be. If you currently have a brick mailbox it is likely that a locking mailbox can be retrofitted into your existing brick mailbox. It is a great peace of mind to know your mail is protected in your mailbox until you are able to check it.

#### What do you do on the park board?


