Fall weather is officially here, well this week anyway! As we are getting used to the cooler weather and the darker evenings, we like to remind everyone of a few general safety tips to keep in mind before your Thanksgiving gatherings. Smoke detector batteries should be checked every 6 months; we like to use time change to remind us of that! When checking smoke detectors, don't forget about your carbon monoxide detectors as well. Both detectors should be

As you prepare for all your Thanksgiving Day activities make sure no items are left unattended on the stovetop, set timers for baking or roasting, and keep flammable items like towels and potholders away from the heat. Be extra cautious with turkey fryers, using them outdoors on a level surface only. It's also important to have a fire extinguisher nearby and never leave the fryer unattended.

Clean your chimney and fireplace annually to remove any soot and buildup before use, and ensure the flue is clear. Use a fire screen to contain embers and make sure all ashes are completely cool before disposal in a metal container.

When putting out Christmas decorations please Inspect lights for frayed wires or broken bulbs before use. Use LED lights and keep flammable decorations away from heat sources.
