Please keep the City of Mansfield and Arlington ISD in your prayers as they confront their recent tragic situation. I know when Emily got home from school, I hugged her a little tighter and thanked God for the safe environment her school provides. We are all indebted to the teachers and school administrators who are raising our future leaders. As a matter of fact, our city made a proclamation for World Teacher's Day which was October 5, 2021. We are so fortunate to host outstanding schools in our City.

Salvation Army: Dalworthington Gardens' citizens and businesses have very giving hearts. As this year comes to a close, would you kindly consider donating to the Salvation Army? November 2 Tarrant County Bond Election: Tarrant County will hold a bond election on November 2, 2021, and the City has a street project included in the transportation ballot measure. There were very few of our City's projects that met the intent of the bond measure, but Corzine Drive drainage repair was selected for inclusion. If the bond measure is approved by voters, cities all over Tarrant County would receive much needed funding for road projects, including Dalworthington Gardens. The bond is being structured in a way as not to raise the county tax rate, so it is unknown when our City would receive funding. Early voting begins October18-29. DWG City Hall will only be a polling place on Election Day, November 2.

Capital Improvement Plans: The City Council has authorized the city engineer to begin working on capital improvement plans for streets, water, sewer, and storm water infrastructure needs. These plans will provide a layout for council to better plan these needs in the budget each year. Our mission is to mitigate the current issues that we face and become as proactive as possible.

Court of Kindness: We are always looking for ways to give back to the community. Our DPS fed over 1,000 first responders in a 24 hour cookout. We would like to extend our thanks to the volunteers and CPSAAA members who generously donated their time to serve those who serve us. Also, congratulations to the graduates of the 4th Citizens Public Safety Academy. Well done, friends!
