#### **Chief's Message:**

We would like to thank everyone for their continuous donations to our fire fund on the water bill. Your continued support has enabled us to outfit our primary response engine with all new fire hoses and valves. This amazing overhaul keeps us up to date with the new industry standards. We have purchased double jacket attack lines engineered for higher flows, superior heat and abrasion resistance, and increased durability. This hose enables firefighters to advance the hose quicker



due to the low-pressure high-volume nozzles. The new valves will allow us to increase the pressure we can pull from a fire hydrant allowing us to pull more water per minute with low friction loss.

If you are new to the Gardens' we want to make sure that you are aware of the house watch program. This is a voluntary program that is offered as a free service to DWG residents. Anytime (year-round) that you plan on going on vacation contact dispatch and fill out a form and we will have officers check your residents twice a day. We offer this program as a proactive way to assist residents in keeping their property safe with no added worries while gone. For more information on this program please contact dispatch.

#### Hands Only CPR / Stop the Bleed Class

Dalworthington Gardens Department of Public Safety and Dalworthington Gardens Citizens Public Safety Academy Alumni Association are proud to sponsor an AHA Hands Only CPR/Stop the Bleed class on Tuesday, December 3rd at 6:30pm. This is a free community event. The event will be held in the DWG City Council Meeting Room in the Dalworthington Gardens City Hall at 2600 Roosevelt Dr.. Due to limited seating in the venue, reserved seating is required, adults and older children only please. RSVP to dwgcpsaaa@yahoo.com to reserve your seat. What is Hands-Only CPR? Hands-Only CPR is CPR without mouth-to-mouth breaths. It is recommended for use by people who see a teen or adult suddenly collapse in an "out-of-hospital" setting (such as at home, at work, or in a park). The Stop the Bleed course teaches individuals how to provide vital initial actions to stop uncontrolled bleeding in emergency situations.

- Wildflowers require minimal supplemental water once established.
