Dalworthington Gardens Department of Public Safety and Dalworthington Gardens Citizens Public Safety Academy Alumni Association are proud to sponsor an AHA Hands Only CPR/Stop the Bleed class on Tuesday, December 3rd at 6:30pm. This is a free community event. The event will be held in the DWG City Council Meeting Room in the Dalworthington Gardens City Hall at 2600 Roosevelt Dr.. Due to limited seating in the venue, reserved seating is required, adults and older children only please. **RSVP to dwgcpsaaa@yahoo.com to reserve your seat.** What is Hands-Only CPR? Hands-Only CPR is CPR without mouth-to-mouth breaths. It is recommended for use by people who see a teen or adult suddenly collapse in an "out-of-hospital" setting (such as at home, at work, or in a park). The Stop the Bleed course teaches individuals how to provide vital initial actions to stop uncontrolled bleeding in emergency situations.

The Gregg's blue mistflower has been named a Texas Superstar plant for its low maintenance, long bloom period and penchant for attracting pollinators, especially butterflies. Gregg's blue mistflower can be planted from containers at any time except for the dead of winter in northern parts of the state. They bloom from late spring to late fall and peak in late summer and fall.

To be designated a Texas Superstar, a plant must perform well for growers throughout the state. Texas Superstars must also be easy to propagate, ensuring the plants are widely available and reasonably priced.
